Directions: Read *Night*, by Elie Wiesel, and annotate the novel thoughtfully for new vocabulary, figurative language, symbols, and themes. At the end of each chapter, write a sentence that states the main idea of the chapter. After you have finished reading the novel, respond to the prompt below in a short essay. Make sure that the essay is typed, double-spaced, in a 12-point font, using standard writing conventions. You may submit the paper in person or via email (hornsj@pwcs.edu) on or before the due date.

Prompt: How is FEAR used as a weapon in *Night*? Include specific textual examples as support for your answer.

A few questions answered . . .

Do I HAVE to read all of these books before school starts?

No. You are not required to read any of the books other than Night before school starts. However, it is highly recommended that you read as many as possible. We will be studying each work for a limited amount of time, and reading the book once makes completing the tasks you will undertake in class so much easier! I recommend reading The Crucible, Twelfth Night, and Jane Eyre first, as they will be read during the first half of the year, and they will require some time to read thoughtfully.

Do I HAVE to buy my own copies of the books?

Yes. You will be asked to annotate the works we read in class, so you need a copy of the book that you can annotate in. If this is a hardship, please feel free to contact me privately, and we can talk about options to make sure that you can fully participate in class.

Do I HAVE to buy these specific versions of each book?

No. While it is not required that you buy these specific versions, it is recommended. Different printings of texts may have differing page numbers, illustrations, and ancillary materials that can make it more challenging to keep together as we work through the text.
